#### 1. APOLOGIES

Apologies were received from Cllrs Hobbs and Brear.

#### 3. MINUTES OF THE LAST MEETING HELD ON THE 19TH MARCH & MATTERS ARISING

The minutes of the last meeting held on the 19th March were agreed and signed as a true record. Pages 1182, 1183, 1184, 1185 and 1186 refer.

Matters arising:- Page 1182, Item 3 – The Mayor reported the College now had details of the students from the Youth Council who had been involved in the park lighting project. These will be contacted to attend a photo shoot. Page 1184, Item 11 – Cllr Rouse informed members the Transport and Development Committee of ECDC were meeting tomorrow and one of the agenda items related to the formation of a City Centre Management Team. The Clerk will obtain this report for the Mayor.

## 4. QUESTION TIME

District Cllr Sheila Friend-Smith informed members that also being discussed at the Transport and Development Committee was an item regarding retail assessment. She felt it was important that the City of Ely Council be kept fully informed by ECDC on this issue and agreed to raise this at the meeting.

District Cllr Jeremy Friend-Smith informed members he had cycled the new path on the buffer zone in Ely West. The surfacing has now been completed. Some of the area has also been rotorvated. The community will become involved and this will be publicised at the next Ely Neighbourhood Panel meeting. He also reported that with regards to Thistle Corner, Cambs County Council will route heavy transport away from the City Centre. There are concerns regarding the amount of cars parked along King's Avenue, and the County Council need to consider these problems in conjunction with re-routing; eg: double yellow lines and waiting restrictions. Cycle lanes are also not marked properly in this area.

The Mayor had attended the Mayor of Ramsey's charity event; had been a guest of Ely Choral Society at Ely Cathedral; attended the Business Show Day at Ely Market Place; the change of command at RAF Lakenheath; the Churches in Ely Walk of Witness; the announcement of the new Dean to Ely Cathedral; the 50th Anniversary of the City of Ely Military Band. #### 8. COMMITTEE REPORTS

- (i) ADMINISTRATION No report as Committee had not met. Members considered the options for hiring a franking machine and unanimously agreed to the preferred option from FP Mailing on a 12 month contract. They also agreed to the payment of the charges by direct debit.
- (ii) STREET FURNITURE Cllr Griffin-Singh presented a report of a meeting held on the 10th April, which was unanimously approved. Ten new dog waste bins will be ordered. Some litter bins will become dual purpose bins for both dog waste and litter. These will have a waterproof sticker placed on them to indicate this. A City of Ely flag will be ordered shortly. The Council had been asked to consider taking over the responsibility of maintaining two new bus shelters on Lisle Lane. It was agreed the Council would take over the maintenance of these, subject to a satisfactory maintenance contribution being allocated from Sainsbury's Section 106.
- (iii)RECREATION & CEMETERY Cllr Winchester presented a report of a meeting held on the 26th March, which was unanimously approved. The update on the cemetery workshop planning application was noted.
- (iv) CHRISTMAS LIGHTS No report as Committee had not met. The next meeting will be held on the 23rd May.
- (iii) ELY IN BLOOM No report as Committee had not met. The next meeting will be held on the 22nd May.
- (vi) ELY/RIBE Minutes of a meeting held on the 27th March were noted.
- (vii)YOUTH COUNCIL Youth Council had not met as this will become the City of Ely Youth Forum. The first meeting of this will be on the 19th April.
- (viii) DIAMOND JUBILEE Cllr Burton presented a report of a meeting held on the 26th March, which was unanimously approved. Members noted how the plans were progressing for the evening entertainment. Members unanimously agreed to purchase Union Jack flags to sell at the celebrations.

#### 11. TO DISCUSS THE CURRENT SITUATION REGARDING THE LARKFIELD CENTRE, ELY

Cllr Griffin-Singh had raised this issue due to concerns about the future of the Larkfield Centre. She had attended a meeting with Cllrs Rouse and Winchester, with the County Council and other interested parties. It was felt this had been allowed to get run down. The County Council would support the Centre with regards to refurbishment, but not the maintenance/revenue costs. This is a big building which is very much under used and they would like to see it being used by the community more. The Mayor reported he had meet with officers of the County Council, who confirmed they had no plans to move the users away from the Larkfield Centre. Members agreed to form a subgroup to look at the opportunities for this building and to liaise with the County Council. Cllrs Griffin-Singh, Rouse, Arnold, Chaplin and Overall agreed to be the members of this sub-group.
